# Councíl Updates

Council met on Wednesday, August 9 to make decisions and hear reports from the pastor, elders, deacons, and ministries. Here are a few highlights from the meeting:

- Due to growing membership and ministry, the **size of council** will be increased to 5 elders and 5 deacons for the coming round of nominations. Bob Bush's term as deacon has been extended by one year to help facilitate this transition.
- Beginning next year, **council executives** will consist of 2 elders, 2 deacons, and the pastor, to allow for more collaboration and unity between the consistory and the diaconate in pursuing the church's vision and goals.
- Daily fees for **church rentals/special events** were adjusted for custodial and tech services.
- Council is still seeking members who are willing to serve on a **steering committee for the Hispanic ministry.** Members of this committee will assist Pastor John and council in fundraising, leading the church planter search process, and leading the congregation in prayer for this ministry. - The Building and Grounds Committee has secured an **animal control** agency to secure both the church and the parsonage against bats and mice and remove a honeybee colony in the church chimney.
